PARISH COUNCIL

The parish council met on Dec. 13th at Lora Cunningham's home. Business discussed included:

- Percentages of contributions for both churches in the parish were discussed. Currently Bethany contributes 60%, UCC contributes 40%. Council voted to keep percentages the same based on giving units in each church.
- 2023 budget is anticipated to be 98% spent at year end.
- Annual meetings for both churches were discussed. UCC will be January 28th.
 Bethany will be February 18th- UCC will have the early service this day so Bethany can have a meal.
- Lenten services were discussed.
 - Both churches will have services on Ash Wednesday on Feb. 14th, and on Maundy Thursday March 28th.
 - o Bethany will have services on Feb. 21, March 6 & March 20
 - UCC will have services on Feb. 28 & March 13
 - o Both churches will have their regular services on Easter Sunday March 31
- Pastor Deb announced she will retire in the new year. Her anticipated last day will be Easter Sunday. Some discussion was had about the chaplaincy at LMH. For now, the parish would plan to keep it as part of our call. More discussion will take place at the next meeting (Jan. 17th) and we will find documents outlining details of the current agreement in case we need to sub-contract until we call a new pastor.
- Storm procedures were discussed briefly. Currently church presidents have been making the decisions about closures along with Pastor Deb. This seems to be working.
