## FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



By the time you get this we will be into our Lenten journey. "The word is traced etymologically to an Old English word lencten (related to "lengthen," referring to the lengthening of days) that simply referred to the season of spring." It is also related to a Teutonic word with the same meaning." "The liturgical season of Lent coincides with spring, calling to mind the new life and growth, the hope and change that should characterize this time of prayer, penance and conversion. This is the season of initiation into the grace-life of the Church. For 40 days, the Church invites us to start afresh." Those were two of the many entries I found describing LENT.

My sisters and I delighted in snow forts and snowball fights and sledding. I for one can't wait to have the (hopefully gradual melt of the) mountains of snow replaced by green grass and flowers. Oh, let it be so, Dear Lord...this too shall pass, meaning the ice dams in my gutters and higher heat bills etc.) If it's anything like how fast we've flown through January and February, March will fly by and the 40 M-Sat. days and 6 Respite Resurrection Sundays. Days will get longer until Holy Saturday April 8th will spirit us through to the cross and resurrection story for us and our sisters and brothers and neighbors who might delight in the snow until it isn't.

Last Month I did an "official" interview with Stefani Osowski who was to come and be a speaker for our services in November. She is also my neighbor and I so enjoy watching her family outside when weather is permitting. Times when they are enjoying their great fire circle or bicycling and playing. She has a passion for Foster Care both from a professional experience in Social work and a personal history as she and her husband Mark fostered many children. I think of our talk and what a tough winter it has been. She told me stories of the need just for transport to get kids to their temporary safe house until placement. The statistics of Traill county alone were surprising. This fall and winter has been a tough one for many families in our own county and the surrounding ones. I look forward to her rescheduling and sharing with us about ways we could learn more, ways to be involved to make a difference in children's lives even if we wouldn't be foster parents.

Even on some really cold days the delight I see in the children who are sledding on the big Mayville hill makes me smile and remember those times I had with my sisters and friends. I hear folks talk about the expectation for spring just around the corner on March 20th and the possibilities to get out and about as the temps rise. We lose an hour springing ahead with Daylight savings time on March 12th, the almost half way point in our Lenten journey this year. It may not be foster care that God shall give you a call to, perhaps it will be renewal from prayers and conversations during fellowship that will connect you to something new, to spring afresh as the family of God. May you find renewal this Lenten season.
