FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

As we wait and prepare during the season of Advent we are looking towards Christmas day and the birth of Christ.


There are often complaints about the word "Xmas". People exclaim, "They've taken Christ out of Christmas." Christ may have been replaced by commercialism in the celebration of this Festival season, but that isn't where the "X" comes from.



The word "Christ" in Greek looks like this: ΧΡΙΣΤΟΣ (pronounced "kris-tos"). The first letter looks like an "X," but it isn't an "x" as in our alphabet, but a "chi" (pronounced "ki") in the Greek alphabet. This letter has the "ch" sound like in the word "Christ".

While the second letter looks like a P, in Greek it is a Rho (pronounced "roh") and sounds like the English "R". The "chi rho" is a common Christian symbol that uses the first two letters from ΧΡΙΣΤΟΣ. Because of the shape of the letters, the symbol is often mistaken for a "PX", but it is actually "XP". A chi-rho symbol is one of the oldest Christian symbols. Is there one in your church?

Spelling the holiday "Xmas" doesn't necessarily take Christ out of the holiday, it is merely using the first initial of the name of Christ; but then, neither does spelling-out the word "Christmas" put Christ into the holiday. (*excerpt from Brian Stoffregen, CrossMarks*)
