FROM THE DESK OF PASTOR DEB STAVE

Troy introduced me to my husband when he was serving a multipoint parish in the Hatton area and I was in my first parish south of Fargo. Troy and I met at Seminary, he had been a teacher and left to pursue a ministry path. He is again a teacher. Last week he posted a complex math problem on Facebook. Both he and I came up with the solution of 4. When I read the others, who had responded there were different outcomes. I can't remember the first part of the equation, it was a series of multiplication, division, addition and subtraction. I don't remember if there were any parentheses amid the numbers and operations. He must of (like I did) started on the left side grouping numbers so that after what preceded the "...x 0" we ended up with the last step of $2 + 2 =$ thus both our answers of 4. Curious, I scrolled down to read the various comments.

A few folks answered 141 for that complex line of numbers and operations. One person gave a lesson on how 141 was THE correct answer. That led me to look up an article called "What Is the Answer to That Stupid Math Problem on Facebook". One tidbit I learned was PEMDAS - which stands for Parentheses Exponents Multiplication Division Addition Subtraction) and the way to remember it -(P)lease (e)xcuse (m)y (d)ear (A)unt (S)ally - PEMDAS. Oh boy!

I remember the "New Math" my kids, now 22 and 25, did when they were in grade school. A totally different way to do division, to estimate and calculate in steps that were foreign to me so quickly they didn't always ask me to help with homework.

I just spent an hour comparing the Sunday Lessons listed for our two denominations. The bulletin makers, readers and myself find those lists important for preparation for worship. Sometimes it's confusing, which is the right scripture for that Sunday??!!

Both the denominations of our Parish - ELCA and UCC call us to be lifelong learners, recognizing that we are called children of the Living Word. Inviting us to take our yesterdays and todays and walk into the tomorrows with good courage and hope. What's "The" right way to learn and grow in the faith? Which scripture book to read, in what order, what version of the bible?

As a new learning year flies by again whether in the classroom, kitchen, field, gravel or paved roads alone or with others it really does take a village. The living Word of God speaks through the likes of you and me and to the hearts and minds of you and me and sometimes we agree and sometimes we have to listen more.
